

Artistry in Wood Vern Johnson

The 2007 WOW woodworking competition was held in conjunction with the AIW competition and show on November 10 and 11 at the Dayton Airport Expo Center. The large number of winners in the competitions is a testament to the quality of woodwork done by our members. Congratulations to all. Nine people entered 20 items of woodwork.

WOW awards 1st, 2nd, and 3rd cash prizes for tabletop and for floor standing categories. AIW awards cash prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd best of show and for 1st and 2nd best of category winners. Category sub-sets are called classes and are awarded 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize ribbons.

In the WOW floor standing category, Dick Kammerer won 1st place and \$150 for his Federalist table.

Larry Bilderback took the WOW floor standing 2nd prize with his piecrust table and a first in WOW tabletop category, as well as, a first in the AIW Miniature Furniture class and a second best in the Miniatures category, and a best of category for his fire screen entry, for a total cash win of \$385.

Dick Reece and Jim Helmsworth tied for third place cash wins of \$30 each in the WOW floor standing category for a hope chest and a corner chair, respectively.

Gary Terborg took the WOW tabletop category 2nd prize of \$40 and the AIW 3rd prize in the Other Turnings class. Gary also received an AIW honorable mention for his scroll-sawed cornucopia.

Bill Bittner II received an AIW 3rd prize for his chest of drawers while Erin Bittner won an AIW honorable mention for her checkerboard table.

Scott Hamilton won an AIW honorable mention for his scroll-sawed Bible box, a \$75 AIW best of category for his 5th wheel camper toy, and an AIW honorable mention for his candlestick table.

Dennis Thomas received an honorable mention for his step stool and 1st prize for his shadow box in the other class of furniture.

Dale Stephens earned an AIW honorable mention for his scroll-saw work.

Jerry Forner got an AIW 3rd prize in the table's class for his card table.

Terry Phillips and Steve Schoeman got an honorable mention for their cradle.

Steve Bilderback got the WOW tabletop 3rd prize of \$20 for his candlesticks.

WOW - WOCO - SAPFM

Recently Dave Moser (president of WOW) and my self, Charles Murray (president of WOCO) have been sharing ideas. Both of us are constantly seeking ways to improve our respective clubs.

One idea that intrigued me was your two-day seminar, and Dave extended an invitation to attend. Being a member of S.A.P.F.M. a two-day workshop on building Windsor chairs is something I had to make time for.

The presenter, David Write, shared with us all of the tips and techniques that he had learned over the past 20 years or so making Windsor chairs. This included such things as making spindles, legs, seat, and steam bending the continuous arm, along with the correct order of assembling the chair. At the end of the second day, a completed chair was there for our inspection. Any time two or more us can get together and make shavings, count me in.

That brings me to S.A.P.F.M. better known as The Society of American Period Furniture Makers. During one of the breaks I found out some of your members are interested in period furniture. S.A.P.F.M. is a national organization of people who want to learn about the construction, stylistic changes, finishing and tools used to build furniture from 1695 to 1900. The membership is made up of professional furniture-makers, antique dealers, museum curators or those who just want to make a piece or two for themselves.

In our area we hold two local meetings a year, usually around central Ohio. The next one will be March 29 & 30, 2008 in Lancaster. This event will focus mainly on chairs, from developing drawings to the construction.
